



Interview with MAJ Tito Villanueva

Major Tito Villanueva served as the commander of Delta Company, 3rd Battalion, 187th Infantry during Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) in 2002 and as the commander of Headquarters and Headquarters Company (HHC), 101st Airborne Division during Operation Iraqi Freedom in 2003 and 2004. Villanueva remembers that from September 11th afterward, his unit was ready to deploy, and when their sister battalion, the 1st, deployed to Afghanistan, they were on a seven-day be-prepared-to-deploy order for the next four months. In the training time available, he concentrated on basic soldier skills and the completion of TOW tables one through 10. During their first month in Afghanistan, Villanueva's company was the quick reaction force which responded to the accidental bombing of the Canadians at Tarnak Farms, observing the glow of the chemlights used to mark body parts well before arriving at the scene. He notes the initial quality of interpreters was mixed, that they did not understand military acronyms, and that the soldiers did not know how to explain themselves without using acronyms. He also says that in terms of cultural awareness, they did not know...
