



U.S. Postal Service: Deficiencies Continue While Antelope Valley Project Status Remains Uncertain: GGD-99-147

Pursuant to a congressional request, GAO reviewed the project approval process the Postal Service used in proposing to relocate postal operations for the Antelope Valley, California, area from the Main Post Office in Mojave, California, to a new facility in Lancaster, California. GAO noted that: (1) the Service followed most of its key requirements for acquiring a site in Lancaster in 1991 prior to obtaining approval for the proposed Antelope Valley project, although some requirements were vague; (2) one major exception was that review and approval of the proposed project justification and alternatives by the Headquarters Capital Investment Committee did not take place prior to the advance site acquisition in Lancaster, as required by Service policies; (3) Service guidance was unclear because it required that alternatives be identified and analyzed before a project could qualify for advance site acquisition, but it did not clearly state the type or depth of analysis required; (4) at the time of the Lancaster site acquisition, the analysis to support the decision was incomplete; (5) more detailed analyses were still under development; (6) GAO could not...



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
